The Institute brings together faculty, students, and alumni from a number of colleges and schools, including the School of Architecture, the Mendoza College of Business, the College of Engineering, the College of Arts and Letters and the Law School.

The Faculty Director of the Fitzgerald Institute for Real Estate will serve as the leader, chief administrator and research director of the Institute. The Institute seeks to be the preeminent university-based program for research, education, and training in real estate. Qualifications:

Candidates should have a distinguished academic record of research accomplishments and recognized leadership and expertise in one of the disciplines of real estate. Attainment of a terminal degree in the discipline is required. Candidates are expected to maintain a strong program of scholarship and to have a commitment to excellence in teaching at the undergraduate and graduate level. The position includes salary and start-up funding along with oversight of a significant Institute endowment.
