

**Assistant/Associate Professor of Real Estate (tenure-track), Finance Department,
Strome College of Business, Old Dominion University, Norfolk, VA**

The Department of Finance in the Strome College of Business at Old Dominion University (ODU) invites applications for the position of Assistant/Associate Professor of Real Estate (tenure-track), subject to approval, starting the fall 2018 semester. The department offers a B.S.B.A Finance/Real Estate, a MBA, as well as a Ph.D. in International Business with concentrations in Finance, Marketing, Management, and Information Technology.

Old Dominion University is a residential and research intensive (Carnegie R2) public institution with a total student enrollment of 25,000, of which approximately 6,000 are residential students. A third of ODU students are from minority backgrounds and over 1,100 are international students from 94 countries. ODU has a diverse faculty which is 40% female. The Strome College of Business is home to the E.V. Williams Center for Real Estate. This endowed Center offers programs and services to the local real estate community including an annual real estate market review, sponsored research, and guest lecture series.

Seeking a talented individual with the capacity to conduct high quality research and to teach online and in-person undergraduate and graduate level courses in real estate and finance. A successful candidate will possess a doctorate in real estate, finance, or a related field from an AACSB accredited university. Demonstrated ability to perform outreach with the local business community for the E.V. Williams Center for Real Estate.

Candidates seeking appointment as an Associate Professor must have a strong record of teaching and research.

The University's primary campus is located in Norfolk, Virginia, one of the seven cities that make up the Hampton Roads (Coastal Virginia) region. The region has a diverse population of 1.7 million, is a major recreational area, and is home to the Port of Virginia and the world's largest naval base. ODU also offers programs at three higher education centers in the region and through ODU Online.
