



Search for an Associate Professors in Real Estate

The University of Washington's Department of Urban Design and Planning and the Runstad Center for Real Estate Studies are seeking applications for a full-time faculty member to lead the development and implementation of an undergraduate real estate program. The appointment will be tenure-track or tenured and will be made at the rank of Associate Professor (0102). The appointments will be on a 9-month (100% FTE) basis with salary commensurate with qualifications and experience. Qualified candidates will hold a doctoral degree or foreign equivalent in a related field with expertise in at least one of the following areas; housing, real estate development, real estate finance and investment or corporate real estate; possess prior teaching experience and an established record of scholarly research. Expertise in affordable housing and housing policy would be viewed favorably for the position.

The University of Washington is focused on the value of a diverse workforce and the Runstad Center and Department of Urban Design and Planning are committed to engaging educators who can help our students better understand built environment issues from diverse perspectives. We are seeking strong candidates with a commitment to issues of diversity and equity, and whose research, teaching and/or service gives them confidence to engage academic and other audiences from a wide spectrum of backgrounds.

Candidates should provide: 1) cover letter outlining their career objectives; 2) curriculum vitae; 3) research statement; 4) statement of teaching philosophy; 5) diversity statement covering interest, experience and commitment to diverse topic, audiences and inclusive approaches; 6) experience in curriculum and/or program development and management, and 7) the names and contact information of three references. Those shortlisted will be required to provide letters of recommendation on short notice.
